## THROUGH THE LOOKING GLASS LHLONGH THE POOKING GPASS



**What You Need:** 1 mirror, 1 wooden block, a bit of sticky-tack, and this lesson sheet. (Sticky-tack is the reusable adhesive in the small bag. It looks kind of like clay.)


**What To Do:** First, peel off the protective coverings from the mirrors. Using a little bit of sticky-tack, attach the mirror to the block so the mirror will stand straight up against the block.
